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Objective: The first two days of the course will provide speech-language pathologists with foundation skills in Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and Solution Focused Brief Therapy (SFBT) in relation to the assessment and treatment of stuttering. The subsequent three days will equip therapists to deliver parent child interaction therapy for children who stutter.

Workshop Format: This five-day workshop is presented through lectures, small group activities, videos and discussion. Participants will have the opportunity to practice foundation skills in CBT, SFBT and in the use of Parent Child Interaction Therapy. These skills are transferable to work you do with older children and families. Workshop leaders will be available to participants for ongoing practical support during the six months following the workshop. In order to evaluate the impact of the training, participants will be contacted for written feedback in December 2010.

Participants: Twenty workshop participants are chosen from a variety of work settings, including schools, universities, hospitals, clinics and private practice. If in the U.S., eligible applicants should have their certificate of clinical competence. We enjoy a diverse group with recent attendees from numerous states in the U.S., Japan, Thailand, and Israel.

Costs: The Stuttering Foundation provides all conference fees and lodging costs, which includes a per diem for meals. Attendees are responsible for their own travel arrangements.

Accommodations: Workshop attendees will stay in single-occupancy student dorm rooms in the same facility on the University campus. The workshop begins on Monday, June 14, with your arrival anticipated on the preceding afternoon or evening on Sunday, June 13.

Deadline: All applications must be received by March 15, 2010, by mail; no faxes or e-mail. All applicants will be contacted during the last week of April with the decision of the admissions committee.
