The Eastern Workshop Cognitive Approaches to Parent Child Interaction Therapy

Objective: The first two days of the course will provide speech-language pathologists with foundation skills in Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and Solution Focused Brief Therapy (SFBT) in relation to the assessment and treatment of stuttering. The subsequent three days will equip therapists to deliver parent child interaction therapy for children who stutter.

Workshop Format: : This five-day workshop is presented through lectures, small group activities, video-tapes, and discussion. Participants will have the opportunity to practice foundation skills in CBT, SFBT and in the use of Parent Child Interaction Therapy. These skills are transferable to working with older children and families.

Participants: Twenty workshop participants are chosen from a variety of work settings, including schools, universities, hospitals, clinics and private practice. Eligible applicants have their certificate of clinical competence, if in the U.S. University supervisors are eligible if they supervise fluency cases; instructors are eligible only if they actively engage in the supervision of fluency cases or private practice. We enjoy a diverse group; recent attendees came from numerous states in the U.S., Japan, Thailand, and Israel.

Costs: The Stuttering Foundation provides all conference fees and lodging costs, which includes a per diem for meals. Attendees are responsible for their own travel arrangements.

Accommodations: Workshop attendees will stay in single-occupancy student dorm rooms in the same facility on the university campus. The workshop begins on Wednesday, but rooms are reserved for the preceding Tuesday.

Deadline: All applications must be received by April 1, 2008, by mail; no faxes or email. All applicants will be contacted during the last week of April with the decision of the admissions committee.

Continuing Education: Boston University is approved by the Continuing Education Board of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) to provide continuing education activities in speech-language pathology and audiology. This program is offered for 2.9 CEUs (Advanced Level, Professional Area). ASHA CE Provider approval does not imply endorsement of course content, specific products, or clinical procedures.
