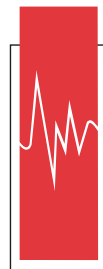

Workshop Format: This five-day workshop is presented through lectures, videos, discussion, Skype sessions with clients who stutter, and individual and small group practice in and outside the workshop setting. Workshop leaders will be available to participants for ongoing practical support during the six months following the workshop. In order to evaluate the impact of the training, participants will be contacted for written feedback in December 2017.

Participants: Fifteen workshop participants are chosen from a variety of work settings, including schools, universities, hospitals, clinics and private practice. U.S. eligible applicants must have their Certificate of Clinical Competence. We enjoy a diverse group with recent attendees from numerous states in the U.S., and Spain, Thailand, and South Africa.

Costs: The Stuttering Foundation provides all conference fees and lodging costs, which includes a per diem for meals. Attendees are responsible for their own travel arrangements.

Accommodations: Workshop attendees will stay in single-occupancy student dorm rooms in the same facility on the University campus. The workshop begins on Tuesday, June 27, with your arrival anticipated on the preceding afternoon or evening on Monday, June 26. The workshop ends at noon on Saturday, July 1.

Deadline: All applications must be received by March 31, 2017, by mail; no faxes or e-mail. All applicants will be contacted during the last week of April with the decision of the admissions committee.

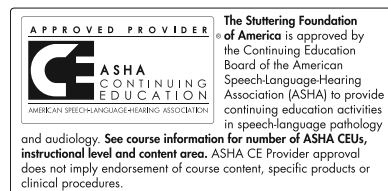
