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Objective: This one-week course will provide speech-language pathologists with an introduction to Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and Solution Focused Brief Therapy (SFBT) in relation to the assessment and treatment of stuttering. Therapists will also be equipped to deliver Palin PCIT (Parent-Child Interaction Therapy), an evidence based therapy programme for young children who stutter and Family Communication Skills Therapy for older children.

Workshop Format: This 5-day workshop is presented through lectures, small group activities, videos and discussion. Participants will have the opportunity to practice foundation skills in CBT, SFBT and in the use of Palin Parent Child Interaction Therapy and Family Communication Skills. These skills are transferable to work with people of all ages and the families of children who stutter as well. Workshop leaders will be available to participants for ongoing practical support during the six months following the workshop. In order to evaluate the impact of the training, participants will be contacted for written feedback in December 2014.

Participants: Twenty workshop participants are chosen from a variety of work settings, including schools, universities, hospitals, clinics and private practice. U.S. eligible applicants must have their certificate of clinical competence. We enjoy a diverse group with recent attendees from numerous states in the U.S., Sweden, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Italy, Japan, Thailand and Israel among others.

Costs: The Stuttering Foundation provides all conference fees and lodging costs, which includes a per diem for meals. Attendees are responsible for their own travel arrangements.

Accommodations: Workshop attendees will stay in single-occupancy student dorm rooms in the same facility on the University campus. The workshop begins on Monday, June 16, with your arrival anticipated on the preceding afternoon or evening on Sunday, June 15.

Deadline: All applications must be received by March 17, 2014, by mail; no faxes or e-mail. All applicants will be contacted during the last week of April with the decision of the admissions committee.

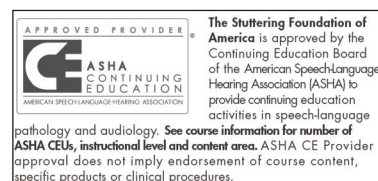
