**Kristin Chmela, M.A.**, was a school clinician for five years then owned a private practice and consulting firm specializing in working with children who stutter. She has presented numerous workshops on the diagnosis and treatment of childhood stuttering for clinicians working in the school setting. She currently works in a private practice in the Chicago area and is an instructor at Northwestern University.

**E. Charles Healey, Ph.D.**, is Professor at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He is an ASHA Fellow, Past President of the Nebraska Speech and Hearing Association, and former Associate Coordinator of ASHA's SID-4. He has published many research articles and has presented numerous workshops around the U.S. on the clinical management of stuttering in children and adults.

**Bill Murphy, M.A.**, is a speech-language pathologist at Purdue University. He works directly with children and adults who stutter and has also worked in summer camps for children and teenagers who stutter. Bill is a recovering stutterer who daily attempts to "practice what he preaches."

**Peter Ramig, Ph.D.**, is Professor in the Department of Speech, Language and Hearing Sciences at the University of Colorado-Boulder. His presentations and recent publications on stuttering pertain to treatment issues related to children and adults. In addition to his university activities, Peter is involved in private practice, specializing in the treatment of stuttering.

**Lisa Scott, Ph.D.**, is Assistant Professor in the Department of Communication Disorders at Florida State University. A Fluency Specialist, she has evaluated, treated, and/or consulted more than 150 school-age children who stutter, and many adults and pre-school children as well. In addition to her clinical work, she has made presentations at district, state, and national meetings, and co-authored several publications in the area of fluency disorders.

**Patricia Zehrowski, Ph.D.**, is Associate Professor at the University of Iowa. She teaches stuttering courses at the undergraduate, graduate and doctoral levels and supervises clients who stutter in the Wendell Johnson Speech & Hearing Center. A recognized authority on childhood stuttering, Tricia has authored numerous publications on the topic, and presented at state, national and international conferences.
